Directions:

1. Print both pages on card stock for durability.
2. Glue the game board on the insider right flap of the file folder
3. Glue the days of the week on the inside left flap of the file folder
4. Cut out the activity pictures and allow the child to arrange one picture on each day of the week in any order he/she would like.
5. Cut out the game numbers (next page) and put them face down.
6. Let the youngest go first. Have him/her pick a game number and move that many spaces. Have the child answer the question.
7. The first one to “finish” wins!
